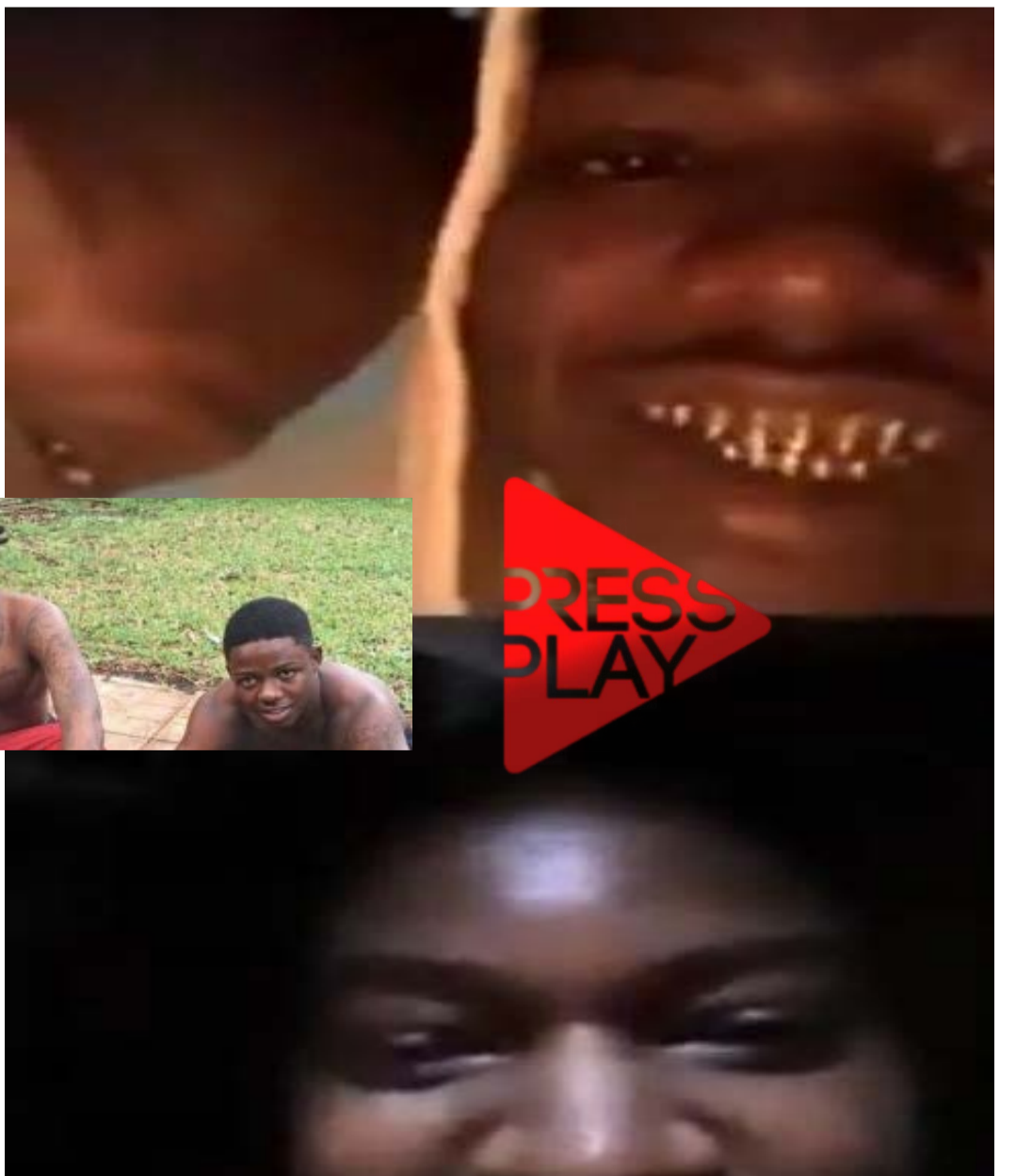
Maan listen, have you ever thought that dumber could not get any dumber than he already was? Well meet Jacko the dumbest dummy we know.

PRISON HISTORY IN THE BAHAMAS

FROM BAYSTREET TO NOW FOX HILL

Prison, has been in existence in the Bahamas since the early days of the colony's development. There must have been some type of jail in the early days of Charles Town (Former name of the town Nassau). Next mention of a jail in the records of the town of Nassau was in the late 1700's when mention was made of a building on the eastern side of Bay and Market Streets. A new prison was in 1790, the building that presently houses the Nassau Public Library on Shirley Street. This hexagonal shaped structure remained occupied until the mid 1800's. In 1864, an act of Parliament was assented for a new prison to be erected

near the town of Nassau because the old one was becoming too small as the population was increasing. The prison was officially opened in January of 1866. According to the available information the prison was described as conveniently situated on a hilly ground and was in a healthy locality. It was a large and commodious building; a common jail with 101 cells, all of which are separate, six being also dark for special punishment. Besides the cells, there are three hospital wards and rooms for clothing, a sick nurse and officers. There are also quarters for keepers on the eastern wing. All areas with the exception of the dark cells are under one roof and the portion occupied by

males is separated by a wall from the portion occupied by females. The "Mixed" group of inmates labored in association by day and was separated by night. The expenditure of the establishment including the salaries of the keeper, captain and all subordinate officers accounted to one thousand three hundred and thirty-one pounds, thirteen shillings and eleven pence. The female prisoners were employed, under supervision of the matron, in making repairing and washing prisoners' clothing. Harden offenders were used to break stones for use in public roads and in ginning cotton. This building remained a prison for 86 years. In March of 1952, the prison was relocated to a new location in Fox

Hill in the eastern part of the island of New Providence. It consisted of three main buildings, the Main Prison with a capacity for 224; a First Offenders' Prison located near the original entrance capable of housing 80 inmates and a Female Prison with a capacity for 30 inmates. The "Annex" housing up to 100 illegal immigrants was completed in 1965. There was a small ground of farm buildings for livestock and at the Southern End of the site of the site a number of staff residences; a new single officers housing and a canteen building.

Other buildings added later were the Medium Security Unit, a New Female Prison, Remand Centre and Central Intake.

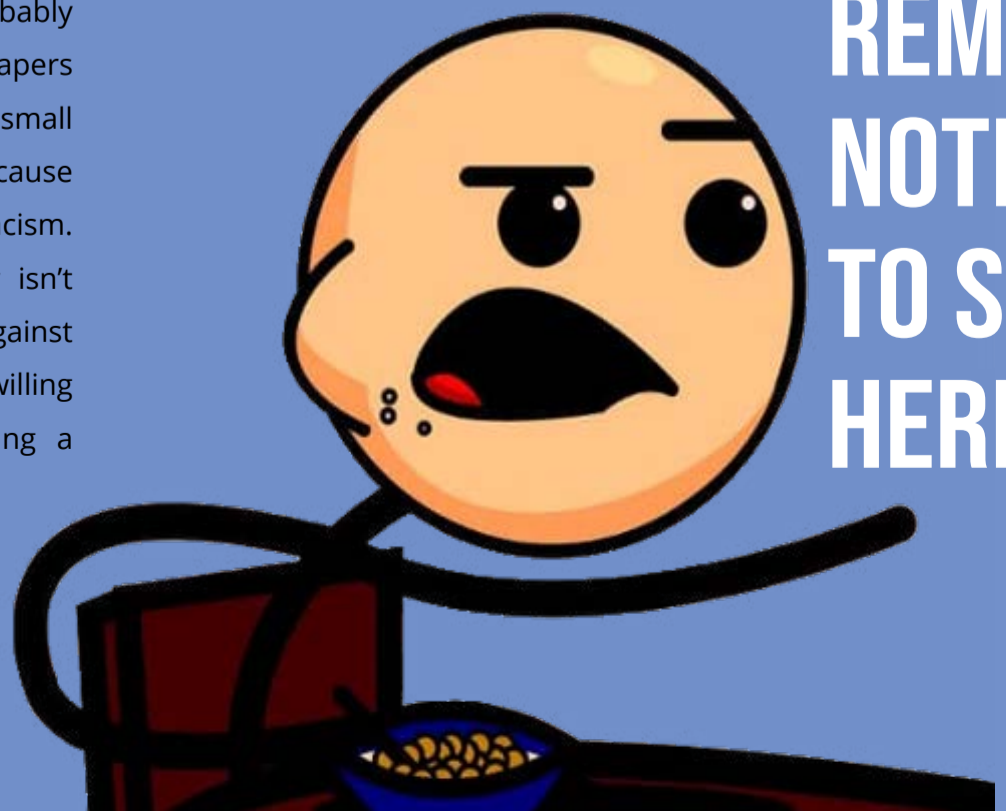

Marcille gave birth to her son and third Maverick Sterling, her second child with husband Michael Sterling on September 27, just nine

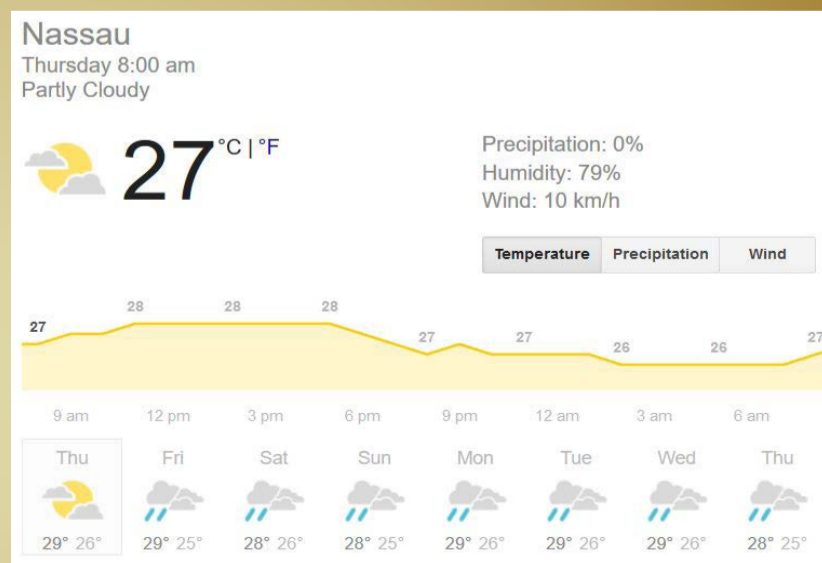
days after revealing the jaw-dropping maternity images.

SHANE STILL IN COURT ASH TALKS

Ash says he gave \$80,000 to Shane but cant remember when? How about looking on your bank withdrawal summary.

Jonathan Ash, the key witness in the bribery trial of former Cabinet minister Shane Gibson, testified yesterday that he paid between \$5,000 and \$10,000 to numerous former Progressive Liberal Party (PLP) MPs.

Continuing his testimony in the Supreme Court before Justice Carolita Bethel, the contractor said he made separate payments to the then MPs for Carmichael, Golden Gates, Southern Shores, Golden Isles, Sea Breeze, Yamacraw, South Beach, Bamboo Town and Garden Hills.

Despite the former MPs

for those constituencies being well known, Ash told the court he did not wish to call their names. He alleged MPs sent their colleagues to collect the funds in an attempt to cover the trail and keep their hands clean.

The businessman did not detail why he paid the MPs, but told the court he wanted the PLP to win the general election. He also indicated Gibson, who he referred to as "general" and "big man" was central to these arrangements.

Ash has alleged that he paid Gibson's associate Deborah Bastian \$250,000 on the former minister's behalf. He has also claimed he directly paid Gibson \$80,000 — all based on an arrangement made to expedite payments owed to him for post-Hurricane Matthew work at five dumpsites and in Centreville.

Ash said the direct

payments took place in secret meetings at the gun range and on Baha Mar Boulevard between January and March 2017.

Those payments allegedly began after a January 2017 meeting with Bastian and Gibson at a building on Meeting Street.

Yesterday, Ash recalled that he wanted to acquire land from the Bahamas Agricultural Industrial Corporation (BAIC) and sought Gibson's help.

He said Gibson advised him to speak to then BAIC Chairman Dion Smith and he subsequently told Gibson he would "give him something" to give to Mr. Dion Smith — for the property.

Ash explained in court that he meant he had "cash to bless Dion with to get the job done". However,

Ash never said how much money he allegedly gave Smith.

Of the four properties he was assisted "none was legit, all was just a bunch of crap".

Prosecution witness, The court was told Bastian, who Ash alleged accepted \$200,000 worth of bribes from him on Gibson's behalf, will not testify for the prosecution.

At this, Keith Knight, QC, who leads Gibson's defense, asked Justice Bethel whether the defense could approach Bastian.

The court was presented a bundle of extracts of WhatsApps conversations between Ash and Gibson.

Ash read from numerous Commonwealth Bank statements, which the prosecution said proves

the contractor was paying bribes to Bastian and Gibson.

While the bundle of cheques entered into evidence do not link Gibson directly, on at least two occasions, bank records indicate Bastian signed for and cashed \$20,000 on Ash's behalf.

He said the money cashed was part of his funds he had to pay Gibson as part of their arrangement.

The prosecution also played a series of voice notes extracted from WhatsApp conversations between Gibson and Ash.

In one note sent around 2:23 pm on February 10, 2017, Gibson asked Ash: "Any shingles today?" Ash told the court that shingles was the term used for the bribe money.

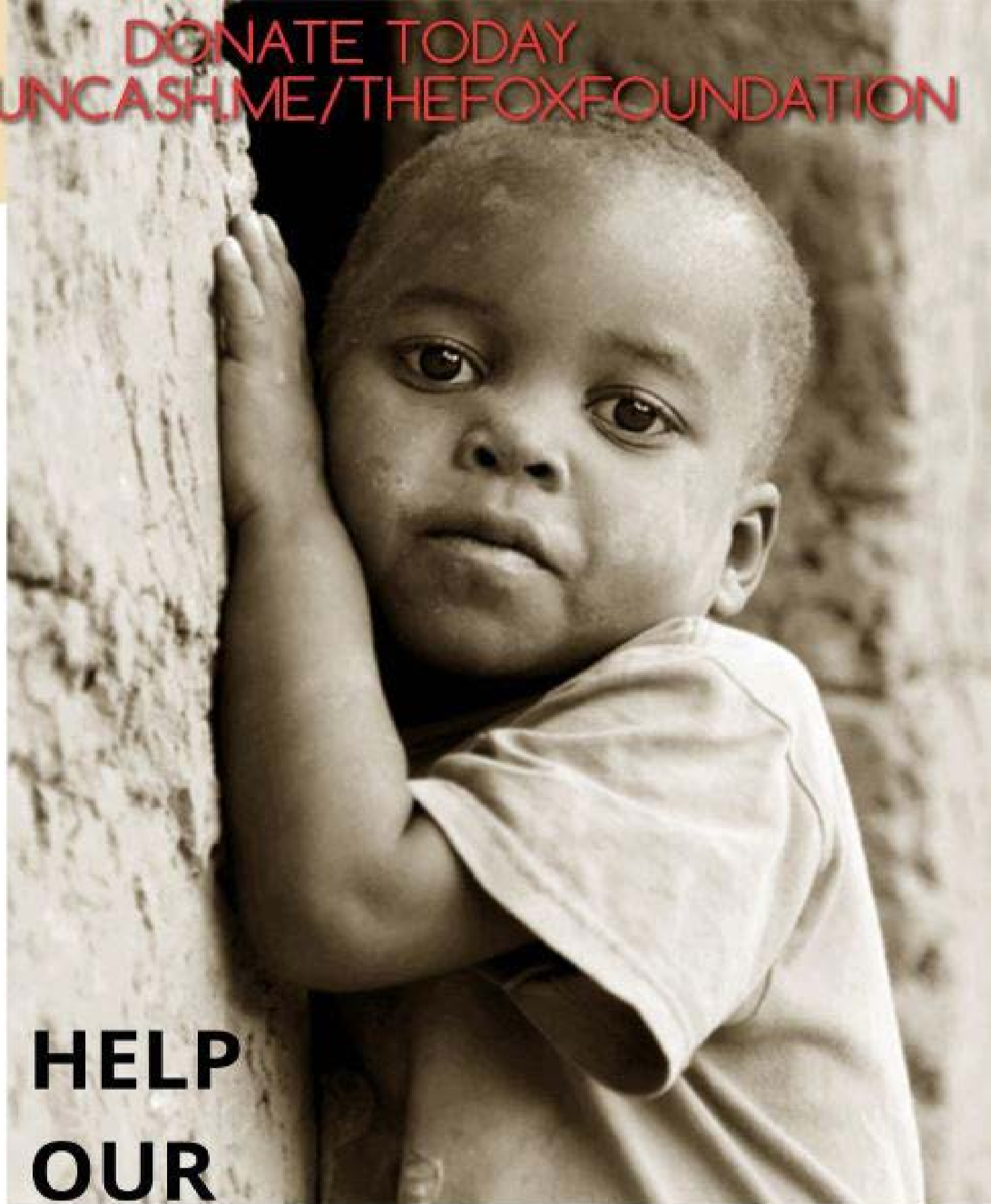

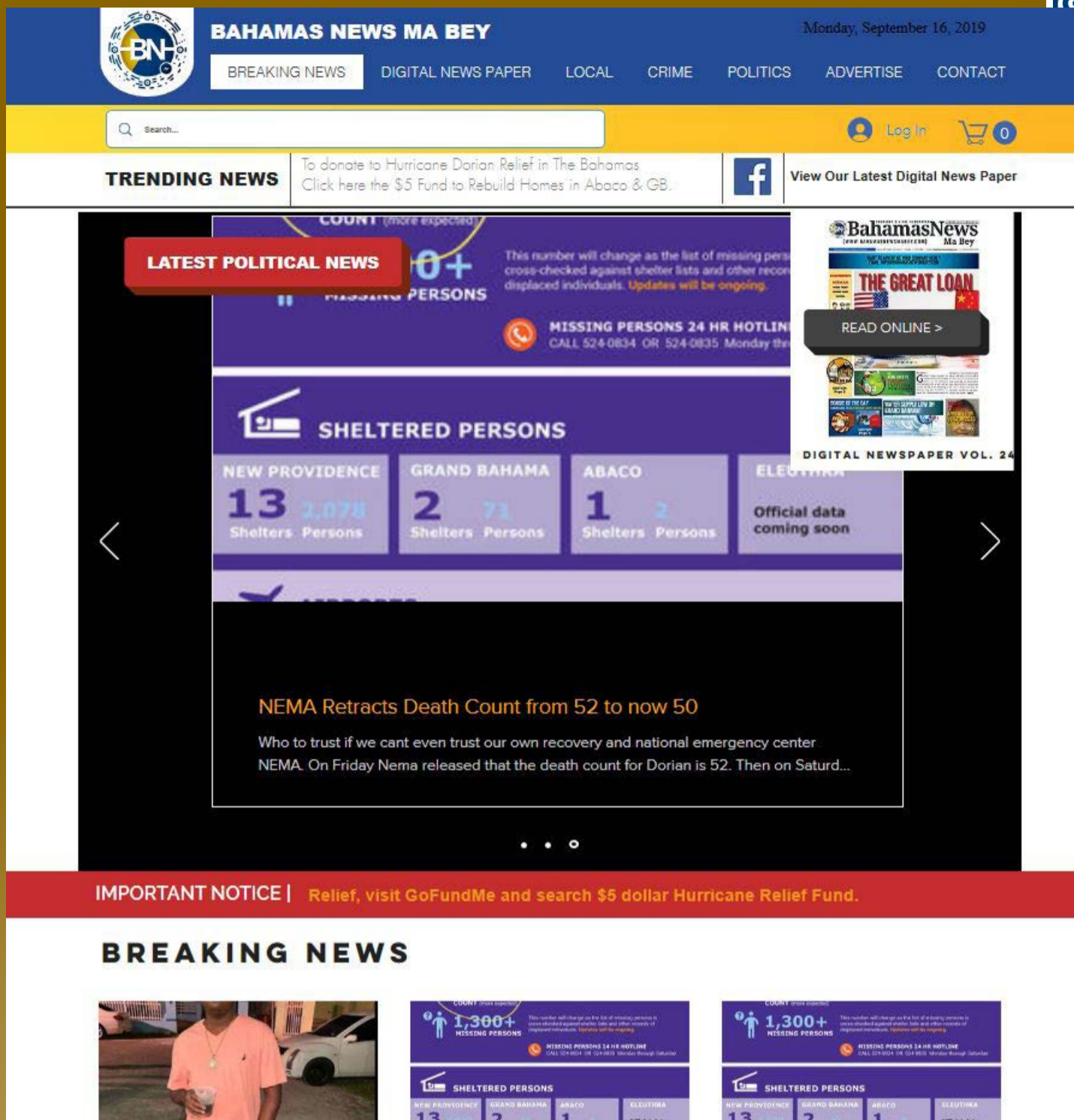
